




Dive into great oceans, rivers, lakes and other magnificent water bodies and explore the marine life with the eyes of young Aqua Kids.

1201: Lake Erie

Climb aboard the Water Taxi with the Aqua Kids as they take a look at the Glaciers that helped form the Great Lakes and the current conditions of wetlands around Lake Erie.

1202: Watershed and Wetlands

Join the Aqua Kids as they visit the Watershed Stewardship Center to showcase the importance of Watersheds and Wetlands.

1203: Lake Erie -Monitoring Lake Health 1

The Aqua Kids take a close-up look at the health of Lake Erie. Come along as they visit the world Famous Stone Lab on Bass Island where they trawl looking for Lake Erie fish diversity, collect tube samples and catch plankton.

1204: Lake Erie - Monitoring Lake Health Part 2

The Aqua Kids continue to take a close-up look at the health of Lake Erie and its surrounding watershed.

1205: Migrating Bird

Lake Erie is prime breeding ground and a stop over site for many migrating birds from around the world. Join the Aqua Kids as they visit Black Swamp Bird Observatory and assist the researchers tag and track birds from across the world.

1206: Lake Erie - Recovery

Join the Aqua Kids as they explore the incredible comeback of the Endangered Lake Erie Water-snake and protecting Wet and Dry Prairies.

1207: Lake Superior - Tribal Heritage - Wild Rice

Join the Aqua Kids on a special episode Exploring the Culture of the Objjwe Tribe . From Birchbark Canoes,protecting Sturgeon to Harvesting Wild Rice and cooking.

1208: Invasive Species

The Aqua Kids dive right into the Invasive Species Issues facing Lake Superior. From Rusty Crayfish and Round Goby's to Invasive Purple Loosestrife attacking the wetlands and marshes. See first hand what is being done to battle these invaders including introducing a beetle that eats loosestrife seeds.

1209: Bogs / Fens

Do you know the difference between a Bog and and Fen ? Join the Aqua Kids as they trek into a Fen teaming with exotic fauna.

1210: Water Quality

The Aqua Kids monitor Dragonfly Larvae for levels of Mercury. Then after taking a Kayak lesson, take off across Lake Superior to do some water testing.

1211: Fishing and Fisheries

Join the Aqua Kids as they take part in a Fish Survey on Lake Superior. From setting the nets to taking counts, the Aqua Kids jump right in to give a hand.

1212: Microplastics

The Aqua Kids go trolling for plastics in Lake Superior focusing on the Issue of Microplastics in our waterways.

1213: Stormwater Management

Aqua Kids don waders and headlamps to climb into the storm drains of Duluth to help divert toxic road runoff from entering a thriving Trout Stream.

1214 : The Pearl

Join Aqua Kid co-host Jeremiah Pearl as he visits the Patuxent Environmental & Aquatic Research Laboratory (PEARL) to learn first hand about the research being done there to help bring back the dwindling Oyster and Crab populations in the Chesapeake Bay.

1101: Water Quality Indicators

The Aqua Kids get a first hand look at the health of South Chickamauga Creek in Georgia.

1102: River Biodiversity

The Aqua Kids visit the Tennessee Aquarium's Animal Care Facility where Lake Sturgeon and Southern Appalachian Brook Trout are being bred and raised, and tag along on a snorkeling adventure on the Conasauga River.

1103: Tennessee Aquarium - Behind the Scenes with Babies

Come along as the Aqua Kids get a very special behind the scenes look at the Tennessee Aquarium, with a close-up look at baby Sharks, Jellies and Penguins.

1104: Minnows & Turtles

See the Tennessee Aquarium's active projects designed to help save Endangered Barrens Minnows and Asian Four-Eyed Turtles.

1105: Oyster

Travel with the Aqua Kids as they sail aboard a Chesapeake Bay Skipjack to learn about Chesapeake Maritime Heritage and the Oyster Industry.

1106: Snakeheads - Invasive Species

Snakeheads, an Invasive Species of fish, are becoming a huge environmental issue in Maryland and Virginia. Check out the efforts being made to stop this invasion.

1107: Marine Debris, Terrapins & Marine Life

Get a close look of the Marine Debris that plague the shore lines and find out how watermen are using a new crab trap design that prevents Endangered Diamondback Terrapins from being trapped in Ghost (lost) Crab Traps.

1108: Submerged Aquatic Vegetation -

See the efforts being made to bring back Aquatic Vegetation important to Marine Life, plus their efforts to revive the Bay Scallop population.

1109: Seabirds

Aqua Kids see the work being done to protect Piping Plovers and their nesting areas. Plus, an up close & personal moment for the kids as they get to band young Ospreys.

1110: Project Terrapin

Aqua Kids learn about the program that creates new, protected nesting areas for Endangered Diamondback Terrapins.

1111: Native American Petroglyphs

Travel back in time as the Aqua Kids discover ancient Native American rock carvings in Safe Harbor, Pennsylvania. It seems these ancient artists had their own Eeojis.

1112: Salamanders

The Aqua Kids visit the mountains of Frederick, Maryland to see how scientist use amphibians like salamanders to monitor the ecology using them as environmental indicators.

1113: Monitoring Fish Populations - Andrews Big Adventure

Join Aqua Kid, Andrew, as he travels the lower Chesapeake Bay with the Virginia Institute of Marine Science. See how Understanding the size and dynamics of the species' population is key to its effective management and protection.

1114: Crab Survey

The Aqua Kids are back at the Goodwin Islands with Dr. Willy Reay of the Virginia Institute of Marine Science where they learn about the hi-tech science behind measuring water quality.

Plus a look at how the Chesapeake Bays Blue Crab population is doing.

1115: Climate Change and Sea Level Rise

Learn how climate change is affecting the fragile estuarine ecosystem and the consequences of Sea Level Rise.

1116: Eel Migration

The Aqua Kids join scientist to see the working being done to bring back the American Eel population in the Susquehanna River.

1117: River Herring Restoration

The Aqua Kids are back again with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to see the efforts being made to restore River Herring to the Patapsco River in Maryland.

1118: Ocean Acidification and Lobsters

Ocean acidification will have severe consequences for marine life and humankind. See what the students of the Marine Academy of Science and Technology are doing to study the problem and it affect on lobsters.

1119: Sandy Hook Bay Life

The Aqua Kids go seining in Sandy Hook Bay in New Jersey to monitor the diverse marine life of the area.

1120: Urban Wildlife

Aqua Kids discover how an area once an industrial wasteland has been brought back to life.
