



The Silent Killer



If its lions in your mind, it has to be Gujarat. Rugged, brown, dry and thorny with a hint of green, Gir is beautiful but harsh teak dominated habitat in the Junagadh district of Gujarat. Far from the stereotypical vision most people have of forests in the tropics, Gir is anything but lush. It is, nevertheless, one of India's most precious and vital biodiversity vaults.



The new tiger land

Few had heard the name of Tadoba tiger reserve in India, or elsewhere till a few years back. This area is now home to one of the largest tiger populations in India.

Land of roar and trumpet

Aptly called the 'land of roar and trumpet', the forests of Corbett National Park boasts of an amazing range of wildlife --- tiger, elephants, leopards and bears. This episode meets some of them.

Poachers turned protectors

An amazing story of a village that was once notorious as a village of poachers, is today famous as the village of protectors. The village wetlands are now home to more than 150,000 birds that flock here season after season.

The Land of Blackbucks

Watch the amazing relationship of humans with blackbucks, and how the local community's love for this wild herbivore has provided the animal the ground to grow even in the desert.

Village of Cranes

In this episode of WILDERNESS DAYS, we will take you to a sleepy little village of which becomes a noisy Crane village with the onset of winters every year. Welcome to KHEECHAN VILLAGE where people do not mind sharing their place with countless Demoiselle Cranes hovering and foraging just outside their home.

Rise of Rajaji

This episode goes behind the story of disappearance and then re-emergence of tigers from one of the major national parks, Rajaji National Parks.

Legends of a tiger

This episode is dedicated to the longest living and hugely popular wild tiger – Machli of Ranthambore! Machli, the legendary tigress, has defied death a number of times. In 2003, she had a fierce fight with a crocodile in which she lost three of her canine teeth. Machli is now too old to hunt, and 2015 could be her sunset year...The story is a tribute to a celebrity tiger.

Living with Leopards

In this episode of Wilderness Days, we look at the man-leopard conflict in the suburban areas of Mumbai. Sanjay Gandhi National Park, housing about two dozen leopards, has turned into a war zone and the humans as well as the big cats have suffered alike. Fortunately, after a string of measures, peace seems to be returning here.

Ray of Hope

Annual floods in the mighty Brahmaputra river wrecks havoc in the famous Kaziranga national park, a home to one-horned rhinos, tigers and elephants. A large number of animals perish in the river's fury, year after year. It's a tough time especially for cubs. This episode looks at this phenomenon and the role a rehabilitation centre is playing in saving some of this precious wildlife.

A tale of Success

Sariska is a major tiger reserve, close to national capital of India. However, its entire tiger population collapsed a few years ago. In this episode, we evaluate the stunning return of the tiger to this national park.

Celebrity Tigers of India

As the title suggests, in this episode we will talk of the celebrity tigers of India. Tigers who are known for their special appeal and who have had huge fan following.

The Rugged Ranthambore

A visual essay on Ranthambore National Park in Rajasthan. The rugged Ranthambore, the last homeland of tiger in Rajasthan, offers views and vistas which are starkly different from anywhere else in India....Ranthambore of late has become synonymous with tiger....Some of the most camera-friendly tigers can be found in Ranthambore....

Man Vs Wild

In this episode we focus on the growing confrontations between humans and animals. Whether it's the tiger, the elephant or even the highly protected one-horned rhino, each one has suffered in these never-ending confrontations. Besides gripping footage, the special episode also carries viewpoints of some renowned experts.

Death in the Himalayas

This episode is dedicated to the heroic struggle of a group of 54 trekkers to stay alive at a height of 19,500 feet. Rare footage of the happenings in the higher reaches of the Himalayas.

God's own country

The very thought of Kerala conjures up images of elephants, unending chain of green hills and unwinding valleys. But for the wildlife enthusiasts, Kerala is no less than a treasure, which only needs to be explored to be believed. Dotted on its landscapes, giving way to some of the most mesmerizing views that one could behold are these pristine wildlife habitats.
